TIME OF REFLECTION and CONFESSION:

The Bible states that God does not "remember" our wickedness (Hebrews 8:12). God is all-knowing. God knows that we have "sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). However, having forgiven us, He is able to treat us as if the sin had not occurred. If we belong to Him through faith in Christ, God does not hold our sins against us. In that sense we must "forgive and forget." If we forgive someone, we must act as if that sin had never occurred. We must begin behaving towards that person as if we had forgotten. We remember the sin, but we live as if we did not remember it. Ephesians 4:32 tells us, "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."
