LIGHTING OF THE CHRIST CANDLE

CALL TO WORSHIP:

Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion.

Shout in triumph, O daughter of Jerusalem.

Behold your king is coming to you;

He is just and endowed with salvation.

Humble and mounted on a donkey.

Even a colt, the foal of a donkey.

And He will speak peace to the nations,

and His dominion will be from sea to sea.

READING: Mark 11:1-10 – Reader: George Dewar

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, 'Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

R1: There were so many things going on in Jerusalem that day. The City 'set on a hill' was filling up with pilgrims from all over, eager to celebrate Passover in their holiest place. The outer courts of the temple were alive with buyers and sellers, money changers, the sounds of doves cooing, lambs bleating and human voices bargaining loudly in the custom of the mid east.

R2: Thirty years later, a Roman governor was to take a census of the lambs slain in Jerusalem and find the number not far off a quarter of a million. Passover regulations required a party of a minimum of 10 people for each lamb. Using these figures we might count up to 2 ½ million people crowding their way into Jerusalem.

R1: The law required that every adult male Jew living within 20 miles must attend the Passover, but Jews from every corner of the world made their way to the greatest of their national festivals.

R2: Did Jesus not plan his arrival on this day?

R1: Could he have chosen a more dramatic moment?

R2: And amazing as it might seem, Jesus and His relatively small contingent of disciples moved into the surging crowd and even though He was riding a donkey, instead of a warhorse, and wearing everyday clothes instead of kingly raiment, the crowd made room and responded with cheers, waving branches broken from nearby trees.

R1: They greeted Jesus like a king and spread their cloaks before Him on the road.

R2: They shouted, "Blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord!" R1, R2: They shouted "Hosanna-Saviour!" A hopeful cry of help for people in distress.

R1: Then Jesus heads straight for the temple, looks around, grabs a whip and begins to upset tables and scatter animals.

R2: "It is written in Holy scripture that the temple is God's house and is meant to be a house of prayer for all nations, but you have made it a den of robbers and cheaters. Get out. Get out! Don't desecrate this place any further."

R1: So the scene is set.

R2: The inevitable circumstances unfold.

R1: The Day called Palm Sunday is also called Passion Sunday because Jesus knew that this act would set off the events that would sweep Him up and nail Him to the cross.

R2: The liturgical colour is red.

R1: Red means celebration. Red means blood; blood shed for us.

R2: Today we recognize Jesus as both the ruler of our hearts and the sacrifice for our sins.

OPENING PRAYER:

We praise you, O God, for your redemption of the world through Jesus Christ. Today he entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph and was proclaimed Messiah and King by those who spread garments and branches along the way. Let these branches be signs of his victory, and grant that we who carry them may follow him in the way of the cross, that, dying and rising with him, we may enter your kingdom, through Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.


